Time Preference:

You will be asked to choose a preferred time (morning, afternoon, or either) to shoot, we will try to accommodate your request but due to the availability of space you may not be assigned the time slot you prefer. Please list any major conflicts with either morning or afternoon schedule.

Equipment Classes:

- **Bare Bow** (longbow or recurve) Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.
- **Recurve Aided** Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin, multiple pin, or hunting style sights. May <u>not</u> be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Mechanical release aids are <u>not</u> permitted.
- **Compound Aided** Bows may be equipped with magnified sights. Mechanical release aids are permitted.
- Compound Unaided (compound, universal or NASP/Genesis bows)- Bows may <u>not</u> be equipped with sights, releases or stabilizers. Any style of arrow rest will be allowed. Mechanical release aids are <u>not</u> permitted.
- Arrows No field tip arrows will be allowed.
- * Each shooter can enter a maximum of 2 equipment classes.

Courses of Fire:

Targets:

- Paper Targets on 40 cm 5-color targets
 - o All shooters will get 1 end of (6) arrows for a practice round
 - o **Juniors in 3rd grade** (Shoot at 20 feet) 6 ends of (6) arrows
 - o All other Juniors (Shoot at 30 feet) 6 ends of (6) arrows
 - o Intermediates (Shoot at 45 feet) 6 ends of (6) arrows
 - o Seniors (Shoot at 59 feet) 6 ends of (6) arrows
- **3-D Targets**, the unmarked distances will be as follows:
 - o All Juniors from 1 25 yards
 - o **Intermediate** from 1 45 yards
 - o **Senior** from 1 55 yards
- * Once Shooter is in the Shooting Ring or Firing Course No Coaching will be allowed. Part of the archer's body must be touching the stake when shooting. (Shooters must touch the stake with any body part ex: foot, leg, etc. while they are shooting.) Participants will not be allowed to walk up to the target prior to shooting.

Scoring:

Scantrons - Shooters will work together to score targets. Coaches will be available to resolve questions. Arrows are scored as they lie in the target or by the identifiable hole if they passed through or bounced out on paper targets. If there is disagreement or any question on a score, it is resolved on all scantrons and/or by calling a range official before any arrow is pulled. All scantrons must agree and be fully filled out.

3-D Targets - Arrows will be scored as they lie in the target or by an identifiable hit witnessed by the group from a bounce out. If an arrow hits the target but bounces out the shooter can count as a hit but will only be allowed to count the minimum score.

Tie Breakers:

- 1st 3D Target score.
- 2nd 10X, 10s, 9s etc.

Time Limits:

- Practice round Shooters will have a total of five minutes per practice round to fire six arrow end.
- **Competition** Shooters have a total of five minutes to fire six arrow end.
- Arrows that remain un-shot will be counted as misses.

Lightning:

- If the 3-D course is called due to lightning shooters will re-shoot the target they are on if and when the course is deemed safe to shoot again.
- If 3-D is called for lightning and shooters are not able to go back outside scoring for both morning and afternoon squads will not include any 3-D targets.
- If the morning 3-D course is called completely due to lightning, the afternoon will not shoot 3-D.

Dress Requirement:

- Close-toed shoes are required unless for a medical reason.
- All other standard 4-H Dress Code rules apply.
- Safe and respectful behavior is expected of Shooters, Coaches and spectators at all times. Disorderly, unsafe, or abusive conduct has no place on the Shooting Sports Range and will not be permitted! Any problems can & may lead to disqualification.
- All certified coaches are encouraged to help with the contest if possible.
- After registering and paying on 4-H Connect, please have a county representative bring the summary sheet located on the last page of this letter to registration along with one County check made payable to: District 2 Shooting Sports Association. This needs to be brought to registration before the first shooter from your county shoots.
