Participants should bring #2 pencils, a clipboard, and measuring tape. Participants may also want to bring a water bottle, screwdriver/trowel, and hand towel for soil texturing purposes. **Entry fees are non-refundable.**

AGE REQUIREMENTS - Age is based on 2021-2022 4-H year age requirements effective as of 09/01/21.

- **Junior** – Grades 3, 4 & 5 (and minimum age of 8)
- **Intermediate** – Grades 6, 7 & 8
- **Senior** – Grades 9, 10, 11 & 12

It is the responsibility of agents to validate birthdates of participants and correct placement of youth in age categories. It is also the responsibility of agents to certify eligibility of contestants and substitutes.

Counties may enter as many teams as they wish. Counties may move Juniors up to Intermediates, but Intermediates will NOT be allowed to move down to Juniors.

CONTEST FORMAT - Contestants will judge four soil profiles with 20 minutes allowed for each. They will then determine the soil characteristics of the profiles and make interpretations based on observation.

STATE QUALIFIERS - Soil Judging is an invitational contest at the state level. Entry in district is not required to advance to state.
