AGE REQUIREMENTS - Age is based on 2023-2024 4-H year age requirements effective as of 09/01/23.

- Junior Grades 3, 4 & 5 (and minimum age of 8)
- Intermediate Grades 6, 7 & 8
- Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 & 12

It is the responsibility of agents to validate birthdates of participants and correct placement of youth in age categories. It is also the responsibility of agents to certify eligibility of contestants and substitutes.

Counties may enter as many teams as they wish. Counties may move Juniors up to Intermediates, but Intermediates will NOT be allowed to move down to Juniors.
